The new call for **Arts in Society Award** has been launched!

**Do you have a special interest in the challenges facing society? Are you inspired to translate them artistically? And are you willing to leave your comfort zone to set up a participatory project with people in a vulnerable position?**

Then you should take part in the Arts in Society Award!

The Arts in Society Award is a project group bringing together Cera, Dēmos and five Schools of Arts across Flanders and Brussels. Through this initiative, we want to encourage young artists active in a variety of disciplines to develop a participatory arts project that responds to a challenge in society. And to do this in collaboration with a partner organisation whose day-to-day work brings it into contact with people in a vulnerable position.

#### Who is it for?

- The project is geared towards alumni, researchers, bachelor's and master's students and trainee teachers at the KASK & Conservatorium / School of Arts HoGent, the Koninklijk Conservatorium Antwerpen, LUCA School of Arts, PXL-MAD School of Arts, RITSC, Koninklijk Conservatorium Brussel and Sint Lucas in Antwerp.
- You can enter the Arts in Society Award **several times**, but no more than once in each of the following categories: bachelor's student, master's student, trainee teacher, alumnus and researcher. Entry is open to alumni up to a maximum of three years of the most recently awarded qualification at the participating art schools.
- **Individually or as a group**: we encourage cooperation with other young artists, but you can also submit a project proposal as an individual.

#### Why take part?

- A working budget of 1 000 EUR is available for projects with an individual student/alumnus/researcher and a working budget of 2 500 EUR for projects with at least three students/alumni/researchers, for the partner organisation, which will take care of the budget management.
- Your project may fit in with a course module that you are following, so be sure to ask your tutors!
- You'll build up a whole lot of practical experience. You'll get the opportunity to cooperate with other artists, a not-for-profit organisation and people in a vulnerable position. You'll learn how to work on a project basis, including drawing up an action plan and a budget. You'll have a chance to experiment with participatory methods.
- You experience how you, as an artist and how art generates an impact on society and people.

#### How to take part?

- Go straight to [www.artsinsocietyaward.be](http://www.artsinsocietyaward.be) and download the application form. You'll also find all the relevant information and conditions there.
- Find a promoter at your art school who can coach you during the project.
- Find a partner organisation in Flanders or Brussels whose day-to-day work brings it into contact with people in a vulnerable position and which is willing to set up a project with you. Discover at [www.artsinsocietyaward.be](http://www.artsinsocietyaward.be) how to find a suitable partner organisation for your project or in your area, or take inspiration from project ideas conceived by organisations.
- Use the application form to work out a project proposal with your promoter and the partner organisation.
